## WHAT WILL VOTERS BE DECIDING?

California voters will be electing leaders to represent them in the following offices:

US Senate

Governor

Attorney General

Secretary of State

US Representative in Congress

Superintendent of Public Instruction

State Senator

Supreme Court Justices

Additional local and statewide positions

Allows licensed Native American tribes and gambling companies to offer online sports betting. If passed, licensed tribes must give up some of their rights under federal law. It also increases the chance that minors would have access to online betting.

**ARTS & MUSIC FUNDING**

Supports additional funding for arts and music education in all K-12 public schools (including charter schools).

**DIALYSIS CLINICS**

Imposes new requirements on dialysis clinics related to staffing, data reporting, and anti-discrimination.

**NEUTRAL**

**PROP 30: TAX FOR GREEN ENERGY**

Increases tax on personal income above \$2 million to fund zero-emission vehicle and wildfire prevention programs.

**PROP 31: FLAVORED TOBACCO BAN**

Upholds the legislation to ban the sale of flavored tobacco products.

## WHAT PROPOSITIONS WILL BE ON THE BALLOT?

**YES**

**PROP 1: REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM**

Guarantees reproductive freedom in the California Constitution, including the right to have an abortion and the right to use contraceptives.

**NEUTRAL**

**PROP 26 : SPORTS BETTING**

Allows in-person sports betting at designated horse racetracks and at casinos operated by federally recognized Native American tribes. Also allows additional kinds of gambling at tribal casinos.

**PROP 27: ONLINE GAMBLING**
